Responsible, with the Chief Education Officer, the Deputy Superintendent of Public Instruction and the Commissioner for Community Colleges and Workforce Development, for leading efforts to integrate education for students among the seven universities and Oregon's seventeen community colleges and with its K-12 schools. Appointed as Chancellor Emeritus, April 2013.
